Bruno Bondanelli is the founder of Design X – Architecture (info@designx-architecture.com). Professor Bondanelli is well known in the Los Angeles Architectural community and has taught courses at both UCLA and USC. His talk will cover the importance of sustainability in design, and social responsibility for developers, architects, and designers. The planning of the city is rarely mentioned by architects when discussing eco-friendly design, His lecture will have as a point of reference Reyner Banham's: "Los Angeles, The Architecture of Four Ecologies", and will include specific examples of green design and urban strategies including examples of his paintings, and architectural projects. In addition to the participation of US and Italian architects, there will be students from the Politecnico di Torino.
